Last time I drove a Skoda Yeti it looked slightly different and was a cheaper variant. I still loved the way it went and how it attracted attention from people wanting to know whether it was as good as everyone said.

So when the latest model arrives in the drive I can't wait to see whether it is beast or buddy.

New Yeti gets the corporate looks to match the rest of the range and it suits it down to the ground. There's nothing wrong with the previous model and the latest is just different. Both are great; the latest Yeti freshens the brand.

What hasn't changed is the fact that it remains a great car to be in. It is large and spacious inside, the glass roof bathes you in light and the dash, trim and ergonomics are perfect.

It is comfortable, practical, well-equipped and just plain fabulous.

The view is amazing and it's an environment in which you simply can't fail to feel at home.

If the previous was cheap and cheerful, then this model is

the serious end of the range. It's not called the Skoda Yeti 2.0 TDI CR DSG 4x4 Outdoor for nothing.

Starting from the left; yes, it's a Skoda Yeti, powered by a 2.0 litre turbo diesel, the automatic gearbox is the magnificent DSG and they don't come any better than that and this particular SUV comes with all wheel drive for the true outdoor experience.

When the confirmation came through of the booking I couldn't help be excited – now you wouldn't expect to say that about a Skoda in days gone by.

And it lives up to the expectation. The engine is strong, smooth and frugal. It pulls, it cruises, it sprints, yet it sips rather than gulps the fuel.
